MINUTES OF MEETING OF SENNA HILLS MUNICIPAL UTILITY DISTRICT

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A meeting of the Board of Directors of Senna Hills Municipal Utility District, open to the public, was held at 7:00 a.m. on December 23, 2013, pursuant to notice duly given in accordance with law.

1. <u>CALL TO ORDER</u>

The meeting was called to order.

2. ROLL CALL OF DIRECTORS

A roll call of the Directors was taken. The Directors present were Chet Palesko, David I. Perl, Gregg Kronenberger and Lisa McKenzie, thus constituting a quorum. Joe Szoo was absent.

Also present at the meeting were Rip Miller, Kemp Gorthey, John Chamblee, Charles Collier, David Malish, Kristi Hester, Scott Manuel, Allen Douthitt and Robert Ferguson.

3. <u>CITIZEN COMMENTS</u>

No citizens were present.

4. MINUTES OF PRIOR MEETINGS

Tabled until January meeting.

5. <u>CLAIM OF JOHNSON GOODE FOR REPAIR OF SEWER LINE AT 10559</u> INDIGO BROOM LOOP

No report.

6. ALL MATTERS RELATED TO WEST TRAVIS COUNTY PUBLIC UTILITY AGENCY

The new fee structure is the same volumetric rate across all Wholesale customers, the base fee is determined on amount of water reserved and the max daily use for Senna Hills will be 575,000 gallons per day there is a penalty if exceeded. Motion was made by Director Gregg Kronenberger and second by Director David I. Perl to approve the contract with PUA. The motion passed.

7. <u>ENGINEER'S REPORT ON SOME OR ALL OF THE AGENDA ITEMS</u>

Robert Ferguson mentioned that the contractor cut some of the electrical lines for the irrigation system. ST will back charge Senna Hills, Ltd. for repairs.

Robert Ferguson stated that there is a RV that is occupied on the property near the wastewater plant. They will determine if it has a septic tank, or if it is connected to the plant.

The design report is in progress, and the engineer will have it complete for the January meeting.

9. TAYLOR LAKE EFFLUENT POND AND THE DISTRICT'S EFFLUENT DISPOSAL SYSTEM

10. THE DISTRICT'S WASTEWATER TREATMENT PLANT

11. <u>BOOKKEEPER'S REPORT, INCLUDING AUTHORIZATION OF PAYMENT OF BILLS</u>

The LCRA and PUA bills are down due to water use. The ST bill includes new membranes. The TML claim payment has been received. Tax collections has prevented the District from having to pull from the line of credit. Gregg Kronenberger asked for clarification on the approved budget maintenance for the wastewater plant.

Motion was made by Gregg Kronenberger and seconded by Lisa McKenzie to approve invoices and report. The motion passed.

12. <u>ABC LOAN AGREEMENT AND RELATED MATTERS, INCLUDING RENEWAL AND INCREASE THEREOF</u>

14. <u>DISTRICT MANAGER'S REPORT ON OPERATIONS</u>

Scott Manuel reviewed the operations report and pointed out that the water accountability has dropped to 72%. ST is in the process of changing out approximately 70 meters that have registered over 2.5 million gallons. ST's target is to have all replaced in 2 months. Motion was made by Gregg Kronenberger and seconded by David I. Perl to authorize ST to contract with JBS to conduct a water leak survey of the entire District. The motion passed.

Board requested that a detail of delinquent customers be added to the monthly report.

Wastewater Plant operations, Scott Manuel reported that we are waiting on Hach to repair a meter before OVIVO will schedule an on site assessment. If Scott can't get Hach to respond and confirm a date ST will notify Board. Scott reported that train 1 membranes are failing and will track warranty on all membranes that are changed. Warranty period is less than 45 days. Board requested that OVIVO attend January Board meeting.

Kristi reported that TML will be issuing reimbursement for the labor on the claim for lighting damage at the lift station that was previously denied. This will be an additional \$4,500 to the claim.

Discussion that the most recent agreement language has addressed most of the concerns of the MUD.

Rip Miller added the plat site plan amendment will need to be granted from the City and then can go back to Tx Dot for consideration they have spoken to both the City and Tx Dot feels they have momentum.

The MUD and HOA want to make sure they are comfortable with the document and attachments before consideration.

David I. Perl asked if the document should include future and cost of new service to the plant.

John Chamblee asked who has the jurisdiction over the undeveloped land, such as area around wastewater treatment plant.

Request updated site plan.

David Malish mentioned that the agreement appears to require a major permit amendment • will discuss this with Mike Willatt.

20. RESOLUTION ESTABLISHING OFFICES AND MEETING PLACES

Motion was made by Chet Palesko and seconded by Gregg Kronenberger to approve CE-Bar Fire Department located at 353 South Commons Ford Road as an additional meeting location. The motion passed. The January meeting will be held at the PUA office.
